## 1. Minutes and matters arising

In matters arising, the President thanked all who had put their names forward for the Long Vacation Committee, Governance Working Party and Masterplan Working Party. She also thanked those who had indicated their willingness to serve on a future Academic Structures Working Party.

It was noted that, if the Governance Working Party required legal advice, it would recommend this to Governing Body for approval and further input before taking such advice.

The Provost for Academic Affairs reported that a new APTF role in Physical Geography and Climate Science had been approved by the Social Sciences Division and would be circulated to Colleges for expressions of interest.

## 2. <u>Statutes Committee</u>

The minutes of the meeting held on 29<sup>th</sup> June 2023 were received.

The Statutes Officer briefed Governing Body on the current mismatch between the Statutes and employment law and the consequent need for updating. The redraft of Statute XV also made the content more subject to control by By-Laws and therefore easier to keep up to date.

The Governing Body **approved** in principle the revised Statute XV – Academic Staff and the associated By-Laws. Formal approval would be at a specially convened meeting of Governing Body in Michaelmas Term.

It was also **agreed** to check the revised Statute against the relevant University Statute to ensure that no further revisions were required.

### 3. <u>President's Annual Review</u>
