Standard deadline for registering for BMAT.

15 October

UCAS deadline for Oxford. Deadline to register for tests administered by the Admissions Testing Service.

20 October

Last day on which the LNAT test may be taken.

2 November

All pre-interview tests administered by the Admissions Testing Service take place in school.

10 November

Deadline for submitted work (except Fine Art portfolios which should be submitted by 4 Nov)

4—16 December

Oxford interviews (see full timetable)

11 January

Shortlisted candidates will be told whether or not their application has been successful.

Oxford's Admissions Tests

For many courses applicants need to take a pre-interview test as part of their application. Find out if there is a test for a course on the Oxford website.

With the exception of the LNAT, all our preinterview tests are now administered by the Admissions Testing Service (ATS). Students should register for these tests via their school or college exams office.



Students can prepare for these tests by tackling sample papers under exam conditions and timing. These are freely available on the ATS and University websites, where they can also access advice on preparing for the individual tests.

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
