1. <u>Minutes and matters arising</u>

The President thanked Governing Body for her period of sabbatical leave which had been very productive. She also offered her thanks to The Revd. Prof. W. Whyte for his role as Acting President over the past two terms.

Governing Body observed a period of silence as a mark of respect for Professor Sir Roger Elliott FRS.

The minutes of the meeting of Governing Body held on 14th February 2018 were **approved** with one amendment.

In response to questions from Professor Whittaker and Professor Bray, the Principal Bursar noted the previous discussions of the plans for conservation improvements to the Laudian and Old Library, and the conversion of the Paddy Room back into tutors' rooms. More detailed designs would be presented in due course. 4. Trustee of St John's College Staff Pension Fund

5. Director of Development and Alumni Relations

The Principal Bursar reported that Mr Robert Crow had been appointed as Director of Development and Alumni Relations and would start in post on 14th May 2018.

The Governing Body **elected** Mr Crow to a Supernumerary Fellowship, coterminous with his holding the post of Director of Development and Alumni Relations. On completion of his one-year probationary period, Mr Crow would become a full member of Governing Body.

6. <u>USS update</u>

The Finance Bursar updated Governing Body on USS. She noted that she was reporting to Governing Body in its role as employer and with trustee responsibilities in mind.

She summarised developments to date and the possible scenarios that might result from the various proposals presented so far. Her slides would be circulated.

7. <u>Any other business</u>

The Fellow for Equality briefed Governing Body on a proposal to hold a late informal hall on 21st May during Ramadan both to support Muslim students in College who were fasting and also to develop greater understanding and positive relationships within College between Muslims and other students.
