Or just as an eye, a hand, a foot and generally each and every part of the body appears as having some function, in the same way is there a function for human beings too?' (ARISTOTLE). Do human beings have a function? What is it?
- 4. Why are mythological scenes so prevalent in Greek and Roman art and archaeology?
