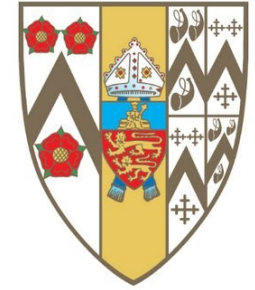


State School Study Day in Geography
