		This will be a short service, lasting about 30 minutes; it will be a time to reflect and pause, after which I invite you to stay around for a virtual glass of sherry or other refreshment of your choosing. Or, of course, run away. Your call. There may be music.
MONDAY	8.30 am	MORNING PRAYER
		Much simpler: the morning service as set out in the Book of Common Prayer of 1662, which is largely the same each day – allowing familiarity with the texts (a good thing) and with changing daily reading from Bede's <i>Ecclesiastical History</i> and the psalms. Lasts about 15 minutes.
		Please note: strictly Oxford time.
TUESDAY	8.30 am	MORNING PRAYER As above.
WEDNESDAY	8.30 am	MORNING PRAYER And again.
	9.30pm	COMPLINE The night office of the church, lasting about 10 minutes.
THURSDAY	8.30 am	MORNING PRAYER And again.
FRIDAY	8.30 am	MORNING PRAYER WITH LITANY
		We finish the week with penitence, so add three minutes to the running time.
